3. Inspiration: Project Shows are regular events at all HORNBACH stores – the perfect place to spice up your own plans with new ideas.

















5. Mission accomplished! Emma adores the new wallpaper and has dressed herself up for the first playtime in her new bedroom.






PROJECT FOR INDIVIDUALISTS

First digital, then real: Environmental educator Max Dreier builds his own furniture. HORNBACH's website gives him the assembly instructions he needs. At the store, he then finds the materials and can pick the expert's brains.



1. Max prints out the list of materials and heads to his HORNBACH store. As well as materials, he also gets a free tip or two about how to process them.

Max Dreier is not one to buy readyto-use furniture, he prefers to build his own. He found the assembly instructions for his »bench project« online at HORNBACH.





2. Made-to-measure: The store employee cuts the multiplex boards right down to the nearest millimeter. 3. The DIY fan chooses the type of mounting he wants at the HORNBACH store. 4. From nails to wood oil: Max finds all the materials he needs in the specialist departments.
